In addition to this excellent training, students will receive a tuition waiver for an elective in aging.

- Successful completion of Foundation coursework and field placement.
- Good academic standing and proven ability to work well with clients, colleagues, and instructors.
- > Interest in geriatric social work in small towns and rural areas.
- Potential to provide leadership in the field
- > Reliable transportation and willingness to travel at least one day per week to a rural area.
- > No criminal history or problems obtaining clearances.
- > A commitment to participate in/complete:
 - \circ an advanced rotational field placement in our partner agencies
 - o an online MS-PP field seminar in addition to a regular field seminar
 - SOWK 693: Contemporary Issues in Aging/Summer Institute on Aging
 - GERO 691: Introduction to Gerontology
 - MS-PP program evaluation activities

Applications for the program are due **Friday, February 18. 2010**. Students will be chosen from the Morgantown, Martinsburg, and Charleston/Beckley MSW Programs.
