BridgesDH NSF NRT Fellowships Opportunities for Summer 2024, Gohort

The <u>NSF Bridges in Digital Health NRT</u> at West Virginia University (BridgesDH for short) is focused on innovative training of graduate students on topics at the intersection of artificial intelligence and digital health.

BridgesDH has opportunities for graduate fellowships in digital health. The fellowship provides a 2-year support for PhD students, and 1-year support for MS students, at the level of \$34,000 per year.

The fellow will work on joint research topics guided by BridgesDH NRT faculty from different colleges/schools around the university, including Engineering, Health Sciences, Arts & Science, Business & Economics, and Law. Each fellow will follow a guided sequence of traineeship elements, including coursework (typically, two extra courses (6 hours)), and mini-seminar series on soft skills, that will culminate in a **Graduate Certificate in Digital Health** at the end of the fellowship.

Fellows with stipends must be US citizens or residents. A GPA of 3.0 or better is required. (**Note:** Non US citizens or residents can still qualify to be a BridgeDH NRT Fellow, and obtain the certificate upon completion, but without stipend support. They could be supported by regular GRA, GTA, GSA, etc.)

- 2-page research proposal relevant to the focus of BridgesDH NRT
- ½ page statement on your view on collaborative & interdisciplinary research

- Unofficial Transcripts (BS and MS)
- GRE scores (if available, important for stipend support)

• 2 recommendation letters from faculty Submit your application by April 26, 2024. Summer cohort starts at the start of Summer 2024.
